

BSc (Hons) Nursing (Adult)



This exciting three year undergraduate programme is designed to develop practitioners with the skills and knowledge to work in the dynamic, changing health care environment.

Fully Funded Degrees

All tuition fees for this programme are currently paid by the NHS; this is subject to change so please check our website for details. Students are also eligible for a means tested bursary which is paid monthly.

Programme aims

This programme has been developed to meet both European Directives and the Nursing and Midwifery Council to prepare nurses who are fit for practice, purpose and award. It will equip you to:

- Understand and reflect on current health and social care policy drivers and their impact on service care organisations
- Show the application of current knowledge and Research into nursing practice, through the skills of critical reflection and analysis
- Understand the interface between health and social care
- Develop skills that facilitate multi-skilling, interprofessional working, role transferability and lifelong learning
- Work in partnership with service users and carers.

Programme structure

Year 1 - The Common Foundation Programme

The main themes studied are: nursing, health, biological sciences, interpersonal skills, psychology and social studies. You will begin your **practice placement** in a local hospital in the first semester.

Year two - Adult Branch Programme which builds on the knowledge and skills gained in year one you will spend an increasing part of your time in practice, which will enable you to apply theory to practice and develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes to become a qualified practitioner.

Year three - Consolidation of adult nursing practice will give you the opportunity to explore clients' complete episodes of care within a variety of settings and develop the skills of managing care experiences. In addition, a library based research project enables you to explore an area in depth and analyse the related literature.

- The Programme has an optional module chosen from a selected list, including a **European or International exchange**.

Programme content

This is a three year full time programme of study which integrates theory and practice. Clinical practice is a fundamental and critical component of the programme.

- You will maintain Assessment of Practice Documents to demonstrate your clinical achievements
- You will work within a variety of settings e.g. home environment, hospitals and the community.

This will include the opportunity to work within one of the largest NHS providers of health care in the UK.



Entry Requirements

5 GCSE grade C or above in English, Maths and Science **plus** either **3 A levels at grades BBB** (with preference given to science subjects),

OR BTEC Extended Diploma (Science/ Healthcare related subject) at distinction/ distinction/ distinction/

OR Access to Higher Education course in either Healthcare or Nursing pathway with a minimum of 45 level 3 credits passed at distinction.
